

# **Grades 5-8 Behavior Expectations 2023-2024**

This year, Grades 5-8 will be focusing on cultivating virtues. Students who demonstrate these virtues will be recognized with a Shout Out and will be acknowledged at school Mass.

Virtues are habits that we can practice using our powers of mind and will to develop good qualities and improve our characters. For example, as a boy George Washington had a terrible temper, but he actively practiced patience and temperance, and as an adult he was known for his self-control.

Virtues have been categorized in different ways. The theological virtues have God as their object; they are considered gifts of God, but they must be practiced.

Faith - a present, trusting relationship with God; openness to His revelation

**Hope** - confidence in God concerning the future

**Charity** - love for others because they are God's children

The cardinal virtues - promoted as 'hinge' virtues by the ancient philosophers, these are conducive to developing one's character as a responsible citizen.

Prudence - think before you act; look before you leap

Justice - do what is right

**Temperance** - self-restraint; moderation; avoid extremes

Fortitude - moral courage

The **7 lively virtues**, contrasted with the 7 deadly sins, are gifts of the Holy Spirit; temperance is one of the cardinal virtues.

**Humility** - the antidote to pride

**Diligence** - the antidote to sloth

**Chastity** - the antidote to lust

**Charity** - the antidote to greed

**Gratitude** - the antidote to envy

Patience - the antidote to wrath

**Temperance** - the antidote to gluttony

There are many other virtues, including **honesty**, **perseverance**, **cleanliness**, **punctuality**, **cleanliness**, **docility**. All of these are good habits; practicing them will build character.

- keeping my hands and feet to myself TEMPERANCE
- staying in my seat TEMPERANCE
- playing games fairly and by the rules TEMPERANCE
- helping a classmate CHARITY
- saying kind and/or encouraging words and using a respectful tone with others CHARITY
- saying "May I", "Please", "Thank You", and "You're Welcome" GRATITUDE
- holding the door for the person behind me CHARITY

#### RESPONSIBLE

- wearing the correct uniform and shoes DILIGENCE
- wearing the correct P.E. uniform on the correct day DILIGENCE
- bringing my bookbag, take-home folder, and/or planner to school every day DILIGENCE
- completing all of my classwork neatly and on time DILIGENCE
- completing all of my homework neatly and on time DILIGENCE
- keeping my desk/locker neat & organized DILIGENCE
- cleaning up after myself or others without being asked CHARITY
- completing tasks or assigned jobs without a reminder DILIGENCE
- having a positive attitude TEMPERANCE
- taking responsibility for my actions, apologizing genuinely, and making better choices FORTITUDE
- standing up for myself FORTITUDE
- standing up for someone else FORTITUDE

Students in Grades 5-8 are expected to make good choices throughout the building during the school day. Failure to do what is expected will result in a logical consequence. The consequence will be at the discretion of the teacher.

Raise hand to speak (no calling out or speaking while teacher is speaking)	Patience, Temperance, Humility
Stay in seat (raise hand to leave seat)	Patience, Temperance
Complete all classwork and homework neatly	Prudence, Respect, Diligence

Polite and respectful to cafeteria staff/monitor -"Yes, please" and "No, thank you"	Justice; Politeness

Eat with mouth closed (use polite table manners)	Respect for others; Cleanliness
Clean table & floor before table is dismissed for recess	Cleanliness
Eat all of your own lunch (no sharing)	Temperance (moderation; self-control)


Expectations at Church	Virtue

Eyes on Father or readers. No heads down or propped with hands.	Respect
Use song books and sing.	Faith
Keep feet on the carpet (not on the kneeler or pew)	Charity

Expectations in Bathroom	Virtue
Ask permission to leave class; have agenda signed by the teacher.	Temperance
Silent (Voice Level 0)	Respect for others; Fortitude; Temperance

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Hands to self (no horseplay)	Prudence; Fortitude; Temperance
Notify an adult if anything is wrong in the bathroom.	Prudence
Keep bathrooms clean, wipe down the counter, place paper towels in trash can/ frequent checks.	Charity; Prudence
Wash hands; dry them with appropriate use of paper towels	Cleanliness
In and out - no socializing	Fortitude
Flush toilet when finished.	Charity

Stand silently while waiting outside a classroom so as not to disrupt other classes	Humility; Respect for others.
Keep the locker neat, clean, and organized, with only school appropriate items, and no loose food items or empty containers.	Neatness
Locker time: Beginning of the day; before lunch/after recess; end of day. Silently get what you need and move on (no socializing).	Prudence

5	Notice of Concern; Principal will meet with parents and teacher/Guidance Counselor based on severity of behavior.
6	Notice of Concern and an In-School Suspension
7+	Notice of Concern as well as loss of special school events, Dress Down days, field trips, and Round Up Day, etc. at the discretion of the teacher and principal.
